
I am pleased to inform you that, in accordance with Title 36 of the U.S. Code of Federal Regulations (36 CFR Part 401), the American Battle Monuments Commission approves your application for the mounting of a new plaque on the wall of the Friedensmuseum in Remagen, Germany.

The plaque will honor the soldiers of the 9<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division and its attached units, who fought at the Remagen Bridgehead following the capture of the Ludendorff Bridge on March 8, 1945 through March 24, 1945. It is important that the story told by the plaque be historically accurate. We applaud the work you did to ensure that the representations are accurate.
